If you have any questions, please attend your first class and speak with your instructor before purchasing supplies.




Serrated Potters Scraper/Rib	A simple tool used for scoring and adding texture to clay. Highly recommended to purchase this tool for ease of joining handles to mugs, coil building, and slab building. Search for “serrated pottery rib” on your choice of website: - https://www.dickblick.com/ - https://www.amazon.com/	
Clay	The cost of one 25-pound bag of clay at a \$30 value is included in the class price. If you wish to use porcelain, the \$20 upcharge purchase will need to go through the AMFA Museum Store. Our knowledgeable ceramic faculty will provide information on what clay to use. Clay will be distributed by the instructor to students in person on the first day of class. Clay can be purchased in-person through the AMFA Museum Store when needed after the first bag of clay is used.

Fused Glass

We only use Bullseye 90 COE (coefficient of expansion) glass in our glass studio for all fused glass classes. All glass supplies must be purchased through the AMFA Museum Store.

The minimum you can expect to spend during this class is \$85.00 for materials.

Below is a resource list for materials, tools, and equipment used in the class:

Materials/Tools	In-Class Use
Dust mask or respirator	These are necessary when using frit powder and working in the cold working studio.
Notebook, pens, and pencils	These items are for note taking and drawing your designs.
Digital camera or cell phone camera	These are used for photographing your work.
Sharpie markers	For marking glass especially when cold working studio.
Metal ruler, 15 or 18 in.	For measuring glass.
AMFA provides paper towels. You can also use lint free cotton or rags (a well-washed cotton t-shirt works great, too).	For cleaning glass.
Small inexpensive paint brushes (1/4 in. and 1/2 in. sizes are most useful.)	Useful when applying glass frit or when using Glassline paints.
Freezer-grade sandwich or quart-sized plastic bags	For storing small glass fragments.
